Paducah • 19th & Jefferson Sts: Legend has it that General William Clark named Paducah in honor of the "Padouca" Indians, a subtribe of the Chickasaw who lived and hunted in the area until Andrew Jackson purchased the lands between the Mississippi & Tennessee Rivers in 1818.
